#### Recommendation

#### That the Bush Fire Advisory Committee:

1. Recommends to Council that \_\_\_\_\_\_, be appointed to the role of Chief Bush Fire Control Officer.

2. The appointment of the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer be advertised in accordance with section 38(2A) of the *Bush Fires Act 1954*.

#### In Brief

The Bush Fire Advisory Committee (**BFAC**) is to consider and recommend the appointment of a person to fulfill the role of the Chief Bush Fire Control Office (**CBFCO**) in accordance with section 38(1) of the *Bush Fires Act 1954* (**Act**), Shire of Murray Bush Fire Brigades Local Law 2024 (**Local Law**) and the Shire of Murray Bush Fire Brigades Standard Operating Procedures (**SOP**).

#### **Background**

In accordance with the Act, Local Law and the SOP, an Expression of Interest (**EoI**) process was initiated seeking nominations from suitably experienced and qualified Bush Fire Brigade members for the role of the Shire of Murray (**Shire**) CBFCO. The closing date for the receipt of nominations was Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> October 2025.

#### **Report Detail**

Due to the recent resignation submitted by the current CBFCO from the role and in accordance with the provision of Clause 8 of the SOP, an Eol process was undertaken and circulated on the 1 October 2025 to all Shire of Murray Fire Brigade Captains, Brigade Secretaries, Brigade members and to all current Deputy Chief Bushfire Control Officers and all current Bush Fire Control Officers. The Eol closed on Tuesday 14 October 2024, at 5pm.

A copy of Clause 8 of the SOP is attached at **Appendix 1** The BFAC decision making process in relation to the position of the CBFCO is contained at clause 6.7 of the BFAC Terms of Reference. A copy of the BFAC Terms of Reference is attached at **Appendix 2**.

Following the closure of the EOI period, three (3) EoI submissions were received for the CBFCO role:

- Brett Finlay
- Michael Webster
- Robert Wilson

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In accordance with the SOP, a panel consisting of the Director of Corporate Services and the Manager Ranger and Community Safety undertook a review of the EoI submissions as attached at **Appendix 3**, and it was considered that the submissions for the CBFCO role satisfied the criteria as described in the Position Description in the SOP's.

The successful candidate for the role is to be determined by secret ballot by the voting members of the BFAC.

To resolve the vacancy in the role of CBFCO, this BFAC report recommendation and subsequent minutes of the BFAC meeting held on 22 October 2025 will be provided to the Council following the BFAC Meeting for consideration prior to the Ordinary Council Meeting scheduled for 23 October 2025.

#### **Statutory Environment**

Local Government Act (1995)

5.21 Voting

(3) If the votes of members present are equally divided, the person presiding is to cast a second vote.

Bush Fires Act 1954

Section 38 - Local government may appoint bush fire control officer

(1) A local government may from time to time appoint such persons as it thinks necessary to be its bush fire control officers under and for the purposes of this Act, and of those officers shall

subject to section 38A(2) appoint 2 as the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer and the Deputy Chief Bush Fire Control Officer who shall be first and second in seniority of those officers, and

subject thereto may determine the respective seniority of the other bush fire control officers appointed by it.

(2A) The local government shall cause notice of an appointment made under the provisions of subsection (1) to be published at least once in a newspaper circulating in its district.

#### Consultation

In accordance with previously established procedures, all brigades are cognizant of the Expression of Interest process for determining the CBFCO and the DCBFCO positions.

At a specially convened meeting held on Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> September 2025, all brigade Captains and FCO's were provided a briefing about the resignation of the present CBFCO and the Expression of Interest process that would be undertaken.

#### Conclusion

The BFAC recommendation is for the consideration of Council. Should Council endorse the BFAC recommendation the CEO under delegated authority can then formally appoint a person in accordance with the provisions of the Act to the role as Chief Bush Fire Control Officer.

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#### 6 ITEMS FOR INFORMATION

#### 6.1 Chief and Deputy Bush Fire Control Officers Remuneration

A review of the remuneration arrangements for the positions of the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer (CBFCO) and Deputy Chief Bush Fire Control Officers (DCBFCO) identified that the previous allocation of a Shire vehicle is no longer practical following changes to the Shire's fire management structure and internal staffing changes. Benchmarking with other local governments confirmed that no vehicles are provided for these roles; instead, annual honorariums are paid in recognition of the significant time commitment, personal expenses, and statutory responsibilities under the Bush Fires Act 1954. The Shire of Murray will therefore be introducing annual honorariums for the CBFCO and the DCBFCO, with funds to be allocated in the Shire's annual budget.
