In Brief

Simon Allan from Australian Red Cross provided a presentation at the meeting regarding their new TeleRedi Heatwave Program. The program is funded by the WA Government and is completely free to use.

TeleRedi provides critical support for adults (18+) who may be at increased risk during extreme heat, including people who are:

- Physically or socially isolated
- Living with a disability, chronic health condition, or mental health concerns
- Elderly, frail, or recovering from illness
- Caring for someone at risk
- Living alone, with someone equally at risk, or in shared accommodation but socially isolated

Aged care providers are not eligible.

When a heatwave is activated by the Department of Health, Australia Red Cross volunteers proactively call registered clients to:

- Check how they are feeling and identify any signs of heat stress
- Provide reassurance and important safety information
- Support connection and wellbeing
- Provide Psychological First Aid if required
- Escalate concerns to emergency contacts or emergency services where required
- Arrange follow-up calls as needed

Ahead of the season, Red Cross also contact clients to support them with heatwave preparedness activities.

5.4 Beach Emergency Number (BEN) Signs

In Brief

Marion Massam from Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD) provided a presentation at the meeting on Beach Emergency Number (BEN) Signs.

BEN stands for Beach Emergency Number. The BEN system is a unique coding system designed to improve emergency response times by installing signs with unique numbers at beach access points.

The unique code based on an area prefix followed by a one-to-four-digit number is displayed on green and red signs, referred to as BEN signs, which can be seen on coastal paths and beach access points, harbours, estuaries, rivers, boat ramps and fishing platforms. This code is linked to the coordinates for the location of the sign. The official location name, address, suburb and nearest intersection are also on the signs.

These signs provide specific location information, vital when emergency services are deployed in the event of a shark sighting, attack or other beach emergencies. Information is integrated into computer-aided dispatch systems used by emergency services such as ambulance, police and Surf Life Saving WA.

The below four BEN signs are installed in the Shire of Murray -
