

Campfires

- › Solid Fuel Camp fires are prohibited between 1 October and 15 May.

Dogs

- › Well behaved dogs are welcome at the campground but are required to be contained to your camp site, otherwise must be restrained on a leash. DBCA do place 1080 baits in adjacent bushland reserve from time to time so caution must be taken with ensuring pets are confined.

Insect protection

- › Herron Point Campground sits in amongst wetlands so it is also highly recommended to bring insect repellent for mosquitos.



How to book?

You can book your next Herron Point trip online – advanced bookings are required and can be made up to 6 months ahead.

Caravan and camping in the Shire of Murray



Camping or sleeping in a vehicle/caravan/camper van or tent overnight in the Shire of Murray is only permitted in caravan parks or designated RV areas. This includes all parks, local reserves and car parks.

Under the *Caravan Parks & Camping Grounds Act 1995* any person observed camping for longer than 24 hours may be issued with a \$100 on the spot fine.

There are many caravan parks available all year round in the Shire of Murray and it's recommended that accommodation bookings are made in advance when arranging travel plans so that you're not caught without accommodation. Please enclosed a list of available accommodation in the Shire of Murray.

Pinjarra RV site

The Shire of Murray welcomes visitors to enjoy a stay at the Pinjarra RV site, located on the corner of Pinjarra-Williams Road and Fimmel Lane in Pinjarra.

The approved permitted area as highlighted below. Camping on any other portion of the adjacent Reserves is not permitted.



To help ensure a safe and pleasant experience for everyone, please note the following conditions of stay:

Length of stay

- › RVs stays are limited to one night (24 hours), unless otherwise approved by the Chief Executive Officer due to exceptional and unforeseen circumstances;
- › The time frame between one period of stay and the next period of stay, either by the same RV, or the same person, shall be at least 28 consecutive nights.

Site numbers

- › A maximum of seventeen RVs are permitted in the approved area at any one time.

Conditions of stay and important information

General conditons

- › Users of the Pinjarra RV site must ensure the site be left as it was prior to their stay.
- › RVs are strictly to be parked within a designated bay of the Pinjarra RV site.
- › Parking or camping on the grassed areas adjacent to the Pinjarra RV site is strictly prohibited.
- › No tents, camper trailers, or camping in a vehicle that is not considered by an authorised person to be an RV.
- › Any person who returns to the Pinjarra RV site within 28 days will face a permanent ban and may be dealt with under relevant legislation, including the possible impoundment of their RV, vehicle, trailer, or caravan.
- › Anyone who does not follow the policy will be asked to leave the Pinjarra RV site immediately. If required, further action may be taken under relevant legislation, which could include the impoundment of a vehicle, trailer or caravan.

Annexes and other infrastructure

- › Annexes that do not require fixing to the ground and that form part of the RV are permitted.
- › Constructing, erecting or maintaining a fixed annex is not permitted whether attached to an RV or otherwise where poles or other means are used to fix an annex to the ground, a tree or other fixed point.
- › Clotheslines external to an RV are not permitted.
- › No clothing can be hung externally to dry.

Amenities, sullage and waste

- › Accessing any private services or utilities such as power or water outlets is strictly prohibited. Potable water is available at Pinjarra RV site.
- › RVs must be self-contained with on-board toilet/shower and retain all grey water and waste within the confines of the vehicle.
- › Any rubbish generated by a user of the Pinjarra RV site must be removed by the user and the area left in a clean and tidy state prior to the users' departure.
- › No portable generators are permitted (on-board/built-in units are permitted).

Campfires

- › Camp or cooking solid fuel fires are not permitted.

Pets

- › The owner of any dogs or cats brought on site must comply with the Dog Act 1976 and the Cat Act 2011 including dogs having to be on a leash at all times and cats having to be confined to the owner's RV at all times.

The definition of a 'Recreational Vehicle (RV)' means a vehicle that is currently licensed to operate on a road within any jurisdiction that is primarily designed and constructed to provide occupancy to a person or persons, subject to the vehicle being fitted with an operable integrated black water waste system with a holding tank within the RV.

The RV must also have a grey water waste system fitted with the system being capable of capturing grey water without it being deposited on the ground (an integrated holding tank is not required). Grey water can be captured in a separate non-fixed container to be later disposed of off-site.

For the avoidance of doubt the term Recreational Vehicle includes a caravan or other types of vans, buses, coaches or any other licensed vehicle that completely fits the criteria detailed.

The definition of 'Night' means the period between sunset on one day and sunrise on the next day.



Herron Point Campground

Herron Point Campground is a nature-based campground situated along the white sandy shoreline of the Harvey Estuary offering families, travellers, locals and pets a relaxing place to camp.

Enjoy beautiful sunsets overlooking the estuary and early morning wake up calls from the Red Tail Cockatoos. A perfect spot for fishing, kayaking, crabbing, boating or purely for a quiet escape from the commotion of life.



Amenities, sullage and waste

- › Toilets are provided onsite however there are no shower facilities.
- › There is running cold (non-drinkable) water. Campers are required to bring sufficient drinking water for the duration of their stay.
- › Sufficient solar powered lighting is provided at night.
- › There is a basic communal bush shelter located centrally in the campground.
- › Being a bush camp, there is no onsite power at Herron Point Campground, generators are welcome and can be used from 8:00am to 8:00pm.
- › The nearest caravan dump point is located on Pinjarra-Williams Road, Pinjarra just south of Fimmel Lane.
